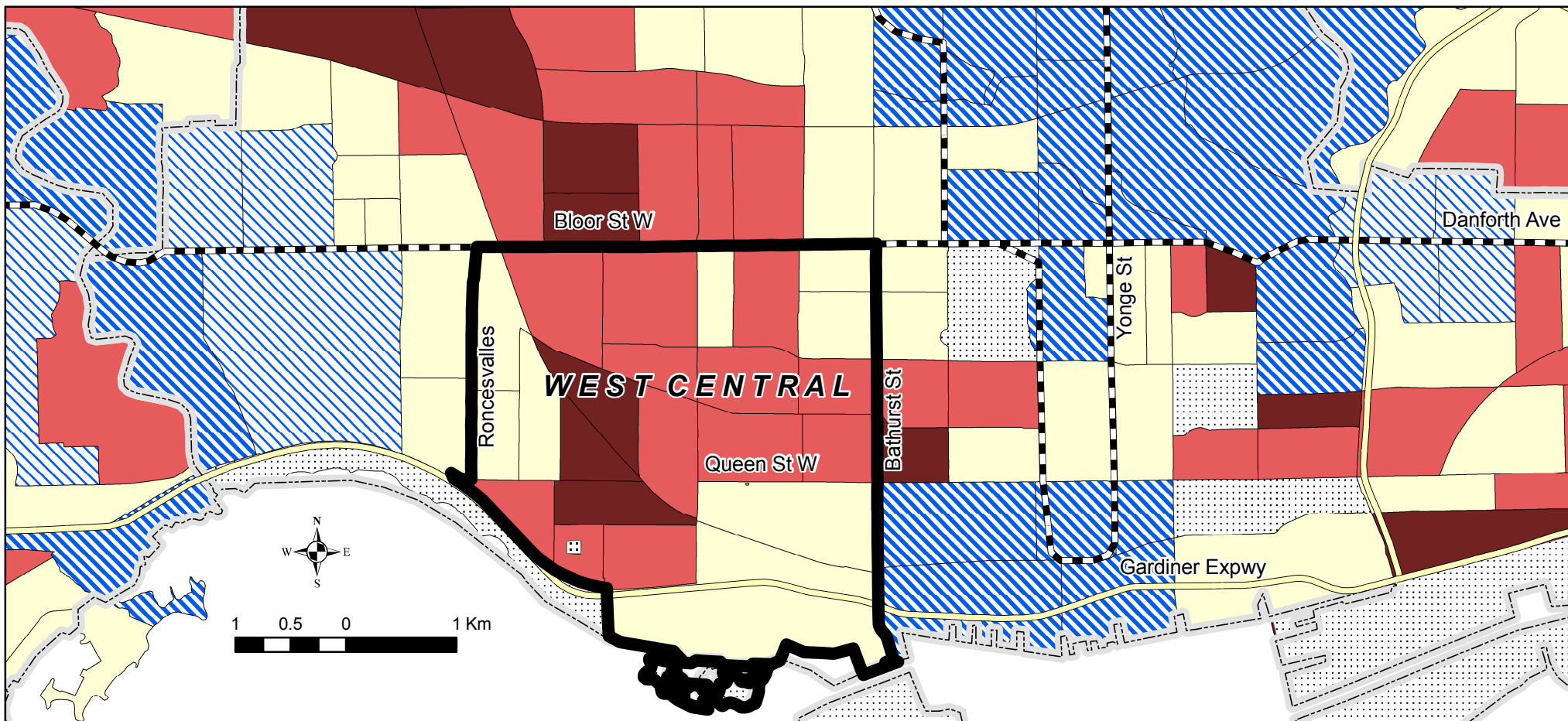


Average Individual Income, West Central Toronto, 2000






Average Individual Income from all sources, 15 Years and Over, Census Tracts




