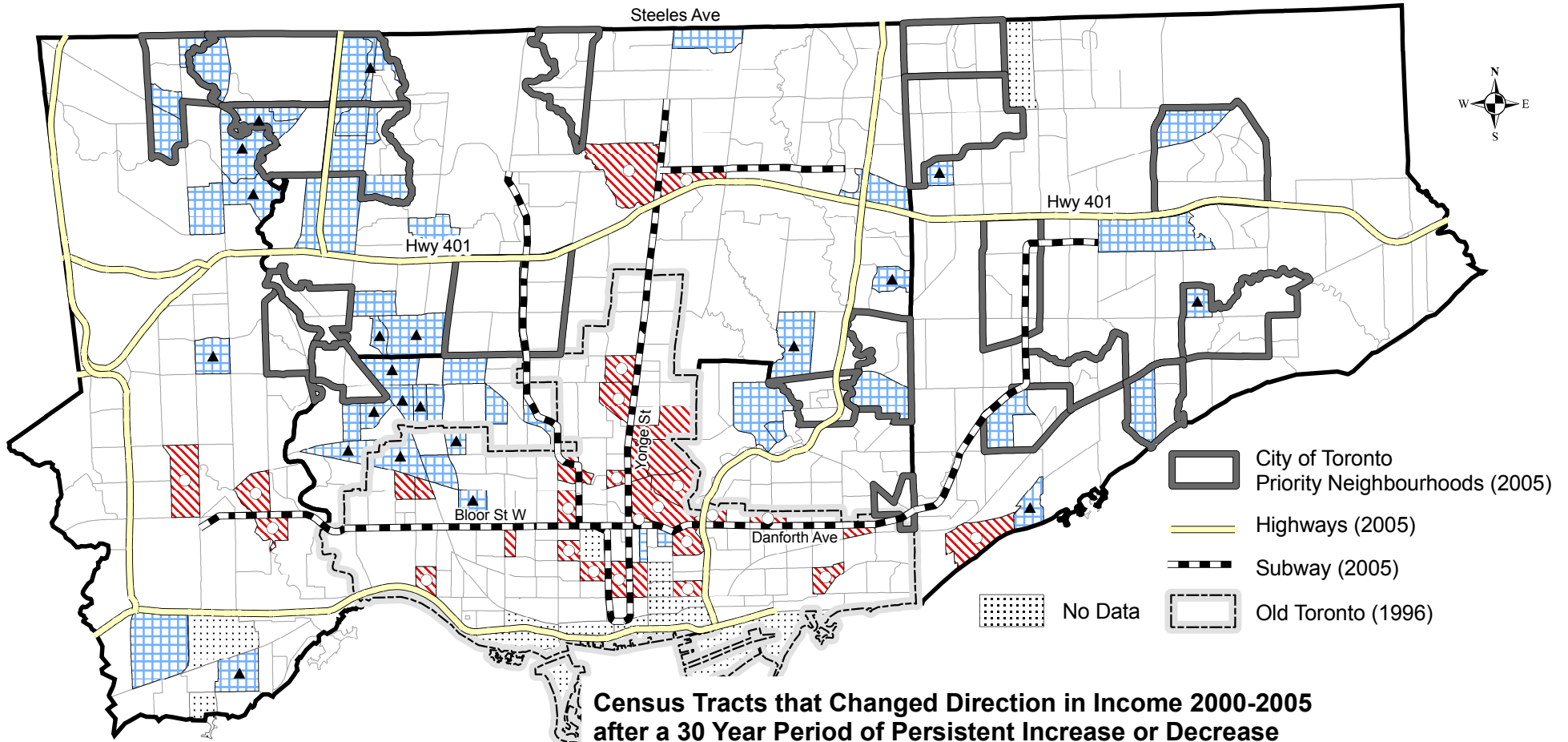


# Census Tracts Breaking their 30 Year Persistent Individual Income Trend by Changing Direction in the 2000 to 2005 Period, City of Toronto



**Census Tracts that Changed Direction in Income 2000-2005 after a 30 Year Period of Persistent Increase or Decrease in Average Individual Income as a percentage of the Toronto CMA Average 1970-2000**

- Decrease 2000-2005 Less than 5% (9 Census Tracts, 2% of the City)
- Decrease 2000-2005 by 5% or More (22 Census Tracts, 4% of the City)
- Other Trends (429 Census Tracts, 84% of the City)
- Increase 2000-2005 Less than 5% (33 Census Tracts, 6% of the City)
- Increase 2000-2005 5% or More (21 Census Tracts, 4% of the City)
