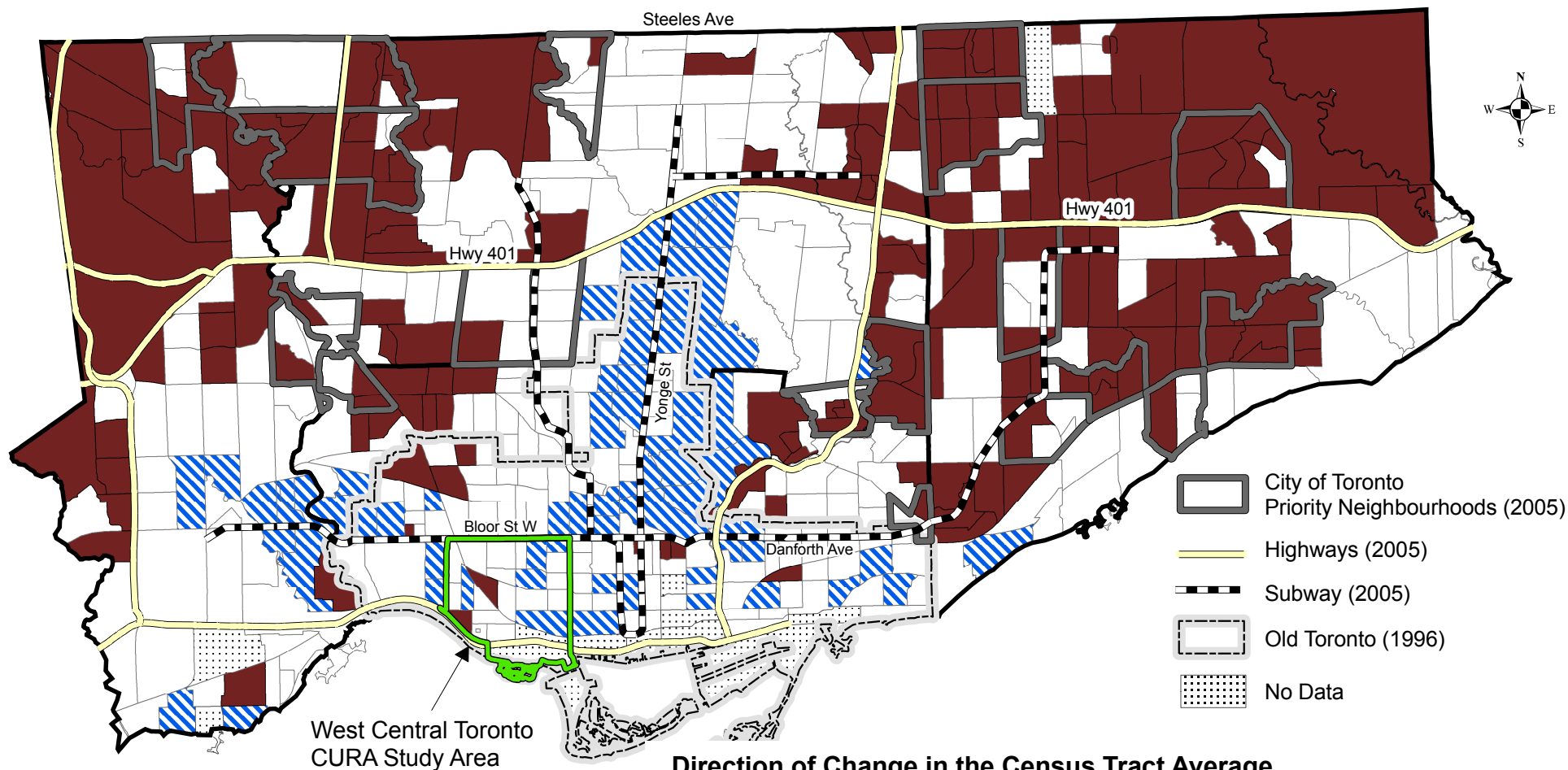





Toronto Neighbourhoods with a Persistent Change in Income, 1980 to 2000

Direction of Change in the Census Tract Average Individual Income compared to the Toronto Average

Time Periods: 1980-1990, 1990-1995, 1995-2000

-  Increasing Since 1980 (67 Census Tracts, 13% of the City)
-  Direction of Change is Not Persistent (260 Census Tracts, 52% of the City)
-  Decreasing Since 1980 or More (180 Census Tracts, 35% of the City)

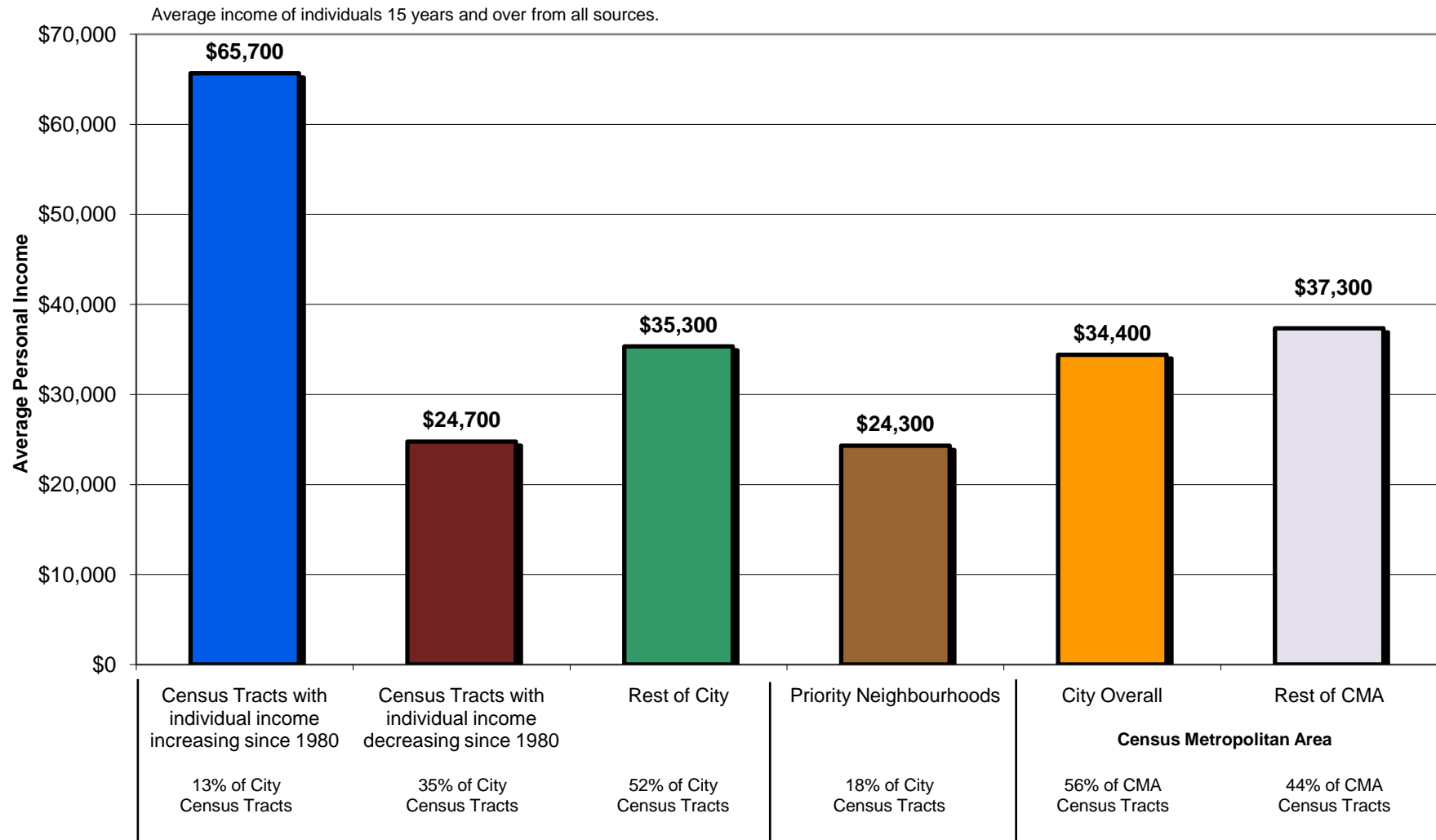
Note: Census Tract 2001 boundaries shown. There were 527 Census Tracts in 2001.

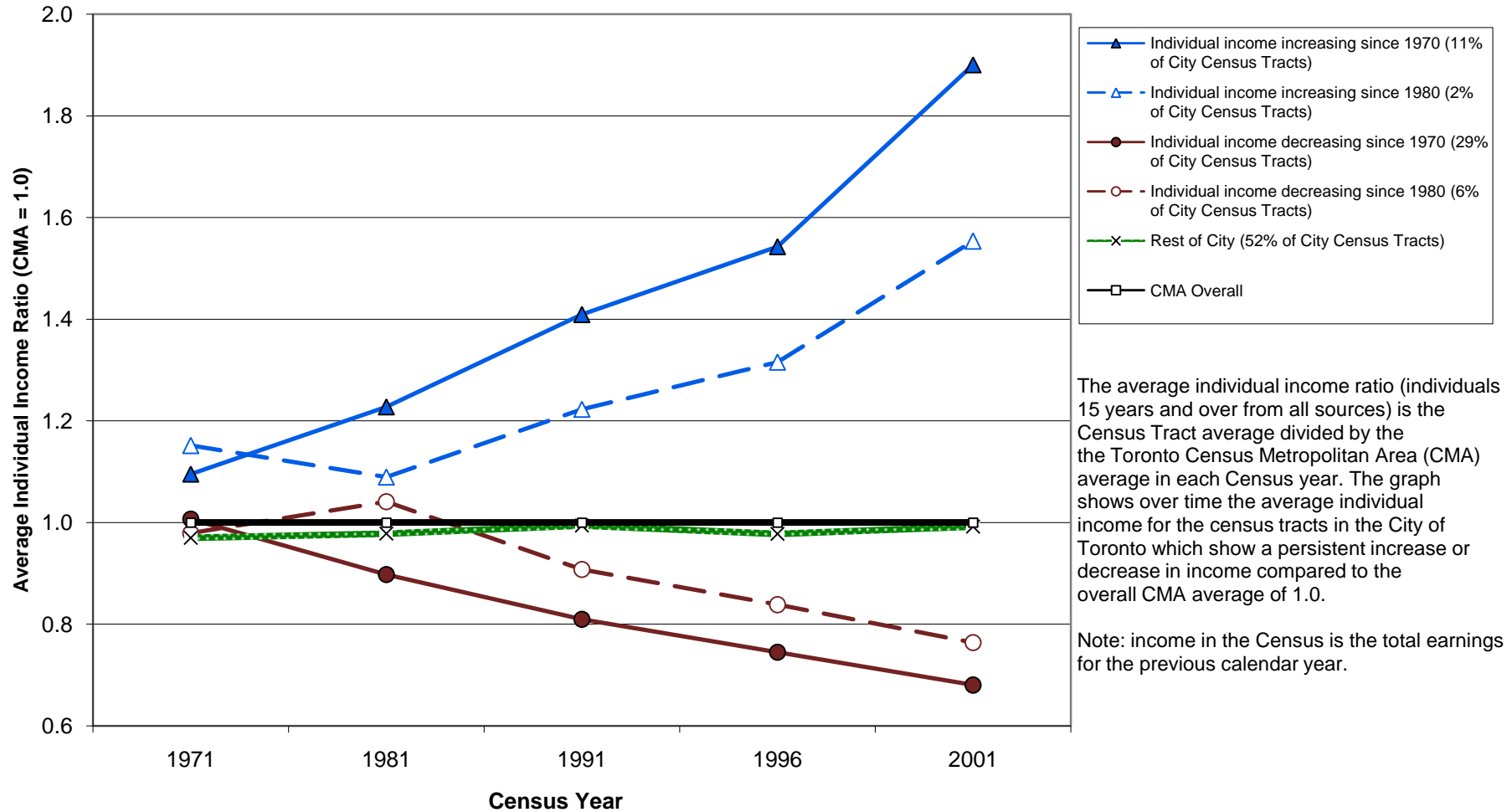
